

COURSE OUTLINE




Hazmat

Course Details:

This course reflects the knowledge and skills required for individual roles in the workplace who act as safety officers and/or response and rescue team members (ERT) in a mine or construction site. These individuals are required to perform tasks involving a broad range of skilled applications applied in incidents involving dangerous goods and hazardous substances and which may involve application of some discretion and judgement in selecting appropriate personal protective clothing and equipment, services or contingency measures to safely combat incidents involving hazardous materials.

Entry requirements:

An individual undertaking this Hazmat course with Risk Management Training Solutions (RMTS) will need to demonstrate the following to be eligible for entry:

-  Sufficient English language, literacy, numeracy and visual interpretation skills to successfully complete this course.
-  Have access to appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
-  Males to be clean shaven to undertake unit: PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit

Unique student identifier (USI):

Any individual undertaking nationally recognised training will need a USI in order to receive their Qualification or Statement of Attainment. If you do not have a USI, you will not receive your Qualification or Statement of Attainment. A USI will give you access to an online record of any training you have completed since 1st January 2015. All individuals will be required to either apply for or provide a valid USI number on enrolment. Licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification considerations:




No licencing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this course as at the date of publication.

However, there are both licensed and non-licensed individual units of competency relating to high risk work in the RII Resources and Infrastructure Industry Training Package and the Public Safety Training Package.

When undertaking training and assessment for PUAFIR207 - Operate Breathing Apparatus Open Circuit industry standards require all participants to be clean shaven. This is a mandatory requirement for the completion of practice sessions and formal assessment.




Pathways into the course:

Participants may enter this course through a number of entry points, demonstrating the potential to undertake vocational education and training at this course level, such as:

-  Participant direct enrolment
-  Employer enrolment (part of your role)
-  Requirement for entering the industry

Pathways from the course:

After achieving the Hazmat course, participants may be eligible to undertake further study to achieve a range of qualifications relevant to their role, such as:

-  PUA30619 - Certificate III in Public Safety (Firefighting and Emergency Operations)
-  RII30719 - Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue
-  PUA30719 - Certificate III in Public Safety (Firefighting Operations)

Course Delivery:

This course will be delivered in the workplace or at RMTS training facilities.

Duration:

The course is delivered over 5 days (8hrs each day)

Course Structure:

As part of this course the following unit competencies will be delivered:

- **PUAFIR210 - Prevent injury**
- **PUAFIR207 - Operate breathing apparatus open circuit**
- **PUAFIR306 - Identify, detect and monitor hazardous materials incident**
- **PUAFIR324 - Render hazardous materials incident safe**

Pre-requisites:

The following pre-requisite units are required to be completed prior to commencing the relevant unit of competency:

Unit of Competency	Pre-requisite Unit
PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit	PUAFIR210 Prevent injury
PUAFIR324 Render hazardous materials incidents	PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit
PUAFIR306 Identify, detect and monitor hazardous materials at an incident	PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit*





*Denotes that these units of competency also have pre-requisites

Further details of unit pre-requisite requirements will be provided at enrolment and on course commencement.

Assessment requirements:

Individuals undertaking this course will be expected to complete both written and practical assessment tasks.

Inclusions:

-  Practical hands-on training delivered by industry experienced trainers
-  Knowledge on relevant legislation and Australian Standards
-  Recommendations and advice for specialised PPE and equipment for your particular workplace
-  Advice on risk control methods for the type of work to be undertaken

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):

If you believe you already hold some or all of the skills, knowledge and/or experience for this course, you may be eligible to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). You are encouraged to refer to our Participant Handbook and RPL/CT Handbook which can be downloaded from our website and speak with RMTS prior to commencing training.

Course fees:

The fee for this course is **\$1495** plus administration fee \$75*

No Statement of Attainment will be issued until full and final payment has been received.

Administration fee:

A non – refundable administrative handling fee of \$75.00* is payable on all courses over the amount of \$750.00 delivered by RMTS.

Payment methods:

RMTS have eftpos facilities available, or payments can be made by direct deposit or cash. For larger organisations seeking training options, RMTS offer purchase orders.

Refund policy:

- A full refund will apply where RMTS cancels the course prior to commencement.
- A full refund of the course fees paid will apply where the participant withdraws in writing 14 days or more prior to the course commencing less the administration fee.
- 75% refund of the full amount of course fees paid where the participant withdraws in writing less than 14 days but more than 7 days prior to the course commencing less the administration fee.
- 50% refund of the full amount of course fees paid where the participant withdraws in writing less than 7 days but more than 3 days prior to the course commencing less the administration fee.
- No refund where the participant withdraws less than 3 days prior to the course start date or after commencement of the course unless special circumstances apply. Evidence must be submitted e.g. Medical Certificate

Course completion:

On successful completion of all unit requirements, participants will be issued with nationally recognised Statement of Attainment for:

- **PUAFIR210 Prevent injury**
- **PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit**
- **PUAFIR306 Identify, detect and monitor hazardous materials incident**
- **PUAFIR324 Render hazardous materials incident safe.**



Participants who do not complete all requirements of the course will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for unit/s completed successfully.
