Work safely at heights

Course Details:

The Work Safely at Heights course is appropriate for those working in operational roles across a broad range of height risk situations and who are required to complete harnessed based work at heights. It is typically delivered to individuals who may work in construction, trades, mining, manufacture and transport industries or other similar industry context.



Training can be delivered in the workplace or at RMTS training facilities using one of our purpose-built working at heights trailers. Work at heights training is focused on fall prevention rather than fall arrest. It is designed to equip workers with the knowledge and skills to safely work in any height situation, primarily being aimed at general construction, maintenance, mining, large factories or other work situations where work is conducted in a place where a fall from one level to another is possible.

Training covers risk assessment, selection and correct use of equipment, rigging, anchor systems, fall restraint, work positioning and fall arrest systems.

Due to the high-risk nature of the industry, the program is regarded as a mandatory requirement for individuals who are required to work at heights and are at risk of falls from one level to another or who are required to work where there is a likelihood of a fall from any height.

Entry requirements:

An individual undertaking Work safely at heights course with Risk Management Training Solutions (RMTS) will need to demonstrate the following to be eligible for entry:

-  Sufficient English language, literacy, numeracy and visual interpretation skills to successfully complete this course.
-  Have access to appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Unique student identifier (USI):

Any individual undertaking nationally recognised training will need a USI in order to receive their Qualification or Statement of Attainment. If you do not have a USI, you will not receive your Qualification or Statement of Attainment. A USI will give you access to an online record of any training you have completed since 1st January 2015. All individuals will be required to either apply for or provide a valid USI number on enrolment. Licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification considerations:

Licensing, legislative, regulatory and certification requirements that apply to this unit can vary between states, territories, and Industry sectors. Relevant information must be sourced prior to application of the unit.

It is designed to meet the requirements of the WHS Regulations, Code of Practice for working at heights along with the Australian Standards 1891.4 for workers who are required to complete harnessed based work at height.

Pathways into the course:

Participants may enter this course through a number of entry points, and must be able to demonstrate the potential to undertake vocational education and training at this course level, such as:

-  Participant direct enrolment
-  Employer enrolment (part of your role)
-  Requirement for entering the industry

Pathways from the course:

After successfully completing the Work safely at heights course, participants may be eligible to undertake further study to achieve a range of qualifications relevant to their role, such as:

- TLILIC0005 Licence to operate a Boom-type elevating work platform (Boom length 11m or more)

Course Delivery:

This course will be delivered in the workplace or at RMTS training facilities.

Duration:

Full course: 1day (8 hrs)

** It is recommended that Working at heights be renewed every 2 years in line with industry standards.

Course Structure:

As part of this course the following unit competencies will be delivered:

- **RIIWH5204E – Work safely at heights**






Pre-requisites:

There are no pre-requisite requirements for this course.

Assessment requirements:

Individuals undertaking this course will be expected to complete both written and practical assessment tasks.

Inclusions:

-  Practical hands-on training delivered by industry experienced trainers
-  Knowledge on relevant legislation and Australian Standards for RIIWH5204D - Work safely at heights
-  Recommendations and advice for specialised PPE and equipment for your particular workplace
-  Advice on risk control methods for the type of work to be undertaken
-  Participants will be placed onto our register to receive a reminder when the Working at Heights Certificate is about to expire. This service is provided by RMTS to assist participants to stay current.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):

If you believe you already hold some or all of the skills, knowledge and/or experience for this course, you may be eligible to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). You are encouraged to refer to our Participant Handbook and RPL/CT Handbook which can be downloaded from our website and speak with RMTS prior to commencing training.

Course fees:

The fee for this course is:

\$260per person

\$1,950 for up to ten (10) work members - onsite training bookings *

* Depending on location of delivery, price may vary for onsite bookings

No Statement of Attainment will be issued until full and final payment has been received.

Payment methods:

RMTS have eftpos facilities available, or payments can be made by direct deposit or cash. For larger organisations seeking training options, RMTS offer purchase orders.

Refund policy:

- A full refund will apply where RMTS cancels the course prior to commencement.
- A full refund of the course fees paid will apply where the participant withdraws in writing 14 days or more prior to the course commencing.
- 75% refund of the full amount of course fees paid where the participant withdraws in writing less than 14 days but more than 7 days prior to the course commencing.
- 50% refund of the full amount of course fees paid where the participant withdraws in writing less than 7 days but more than 3 days prior to the course commencing.
- No refund where the participant withdraws less than 3 days prior to the course start date or after commencement of the course unless special circumstances apply. Evidence must be submitted e.g. Medical Certificate

On successful completion of all unit requirements, participants will be issued with nationally recognised Statement of Attainment for:

RIIWH5204E – Work safely at heights.



Participants who do not complete all requirements of the course will not be issued with a Statement of Attainment.
