

COURSE OUTLINE

RII30719 – Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue

Course Details:





This qualification reflects the role of response and rescue team members who are required to respond to emergencies in surface or underground mine sites and construction sites and who perform tasks involving a broad range of skilled applications applied in a wide variety of contexts, which may involve application of some discretion and judgement in selecting equipment, services or contingency measures.

The course is designed for individuals working in or seeking work in an emergency response role within the resources and infrastructure industries.

Individuals completing this qualification are generally required by a workplace to undertake training in specific areas to develop their knowledge and skills as a workplace role requirement; or are required to complete, update or meet legislated or regulated industry requirements and sites standards set by industry and their employer.

Entry requirements:

An individual undertaking this Qualification with Risk Management Training Solutions (RMTS) will need to demonstrate the following to be eligible for entry:

-  Satisfactorily complete a language, numeracy and literacy assessment (LLN) prior to or on course commencement to assess capacity to meet the LLN requirements of this course
-  Be currently employed or undertaking training in the relevant industry
-  Have access to appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
-  Willingness and ability for males to be clean shaven for: PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit (required under AS1715 for breathing apparatus)

Individuals will also need to have the physical capability to undertake the practical components of this course. If you have poor mobility or a current injury, please contact RMTS to discuss before enrolment.

Unique student identifier (USI):

Any individual undertaking nationally recognised training will need a USI in order to receive their Qualification or Statement of Attainment. If you do not have a USI, you will not receive your Qualification or Statement of Attainment. A USI will give you access to an online record of any training you have completed since 1st January 2015. All individuals will be required to either apply for or provide a valid USI number on enrolment.

Licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification considerations:

However, there are both licensed and non-licensed individual units of competency relating to high risk work in the RII Resources and Infrastructure Industry Training Package.

When undertaking training and assessment activities for unit of competency PUAFIR207 Operate breathing apparatus open circuit, the Australian Standards (AS1715) require all participants to be clean shaven. This is a mandatory requirement for the completion of practice sessions and formal assessment.

Pathways into the course:

Participants may enter the qualification through a number of entry points, demonstrating the potential to undertake vocational education and training at this qualification level, such as:

-  Participant direct enrolment
-  Employer enrolment (part of your role)
-  RPL pathway
-  Requirement for entering the industry

Individuals may undertake the qualification with little or no experience in the industry, however this course has been developed for individuals who have secured employment or a training place within the industry for the purpose of completing this qualification.

Pathways from the course:

After achieving RII30719 - Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue, participants may be eligible to undertake further studies in a range of qualifications relevant to their role, such as:

-  PUA30619 - Certificate III in Public Safety (Firefighting and Emergency Operations).
-  PUA30420 - Certificate III in Public Safety (SES Rescue)

Individuals who are successful in gaining this qualification can expect to be eligible for jobs in the emergency response sector within the mining and resources and construction industry.

Course Delivery:

This course will be delivered in the workplace.

Duration:

The expected completion for this course is 12 months which will typically consist of:

- 1 face to face training session per month in the workplace
- *Additional face to face training sessions for new or inexperienced workers.
- Workplace learning whilst completing your daily operational activities
- Written theory and practical assessment in the workplace
- Maintain Industry Professional Development Logbook relevant to the units of competency being undertaken - 10 hours per month

Individuals undertaking training with extensive industry experience may complete the course in a shorter duration if they can provide sufficient evidence of previous study, knowledge, experience and unit/s of competency that can be used through a formal recognition process.

*Individuals undertaking this training with little or no experience in the industry will be provided with the opportunity to fully absorb the required knowledge and to develop skills over time. This may require a longer time-frame than for those participants with significant industry experience. RMTS provide an additional 5 days face to face training every 2 months in the workplace including additional mentoring and support (if required) to allow each participant the opportunity to complete all requirements for successful achievement of the full Qualification.

Course structure:

As part of this course the following unit competencies will be delivered:

Total number of units = 14

5 core units plus

9 elective units, of which:

- at least one (1) must be chosen from Group A
- at least five (5) must be chosen from Group B, of which at least two (2) must be coded RIIERR
- at least one (1) must be chosen from Group C

- up to two (2) may be chosen from the electives listed below, elsewhere within this training package, or from another endorsed training package, or from an accredited course.

Further details of unit pre-requisite requirements will be provided at enrolment and on course commencement.

Assessment requirements:

Individuals undertaking this course will be expected to complete both written and practical assessment tasks.

Inclusions:

-  Practical hands-on training delivered by industry experienced trainers
-  Knowledge on relevant legislation and Australian Standards for RII30719 - Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue
-  Recommendations and advice for specialised PPE and equipment for your particular workplace
-  Advice on risk control methods for the type of work to be undertaken

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):

If you believe you already hold some or all of the skills, knowledge and/or experience for this course, you may be eligible to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). You are encouraged to refer to our Participant Handbook and RPL/CT Handbook which can be downloaded from our website and speak with RMTS prior to commencing training.

Course fees:

The fee for this course is **\$5,500.00** plus administration fee \$75* payable as follows:

- **\$1000.00** deposit on enrolment, plus non-refundable administration fee of \$75*
- **\$1,500.00** on course commencement
- **\$1,500.00** on commencement of week 26
- **\$1,500.00** payable prior to completion

No Statement of Attainment or Qualification will be issued until full and final payment has been received.

Administration fee:

A non-refundable administrative handling fee of \$75.00* is payable on all courses over the amount of \$750.00 delivered by RMTS.

Payment methods:

RMTS have eftpos facilities available, or payments can be made by direct deposit or cash. For larger organisations seeking training options, RMTS offer purchase orders.

Refund policy:

- A full refund will apply where RMTS cancels the course prior to commencement.
- A full refund of the course fees paid will apply where the participant withdraws in writing 14 days or more prior to the course commencing less the administration fee.
- 75% refund of the full amount of course fees paid where the participant withdraws in writing less than 14 days but more than 7 days prior to the course commencing less the administration fee
- 50% refund of the full amount of course fees paid where the participant withdraws in writing less than 7 days but more than 3 days prior to the course commencing less the administration fee
- No refund where the participant withdraws less than 3 days prior to the course start date or after commencement of the course unless special circumstances apply. Evidence must be submitted e.g. Medical Certificate

Course completion:

On successful completion of all qualification requirements, participants will be issued with nationally recognised: **RII30719 - Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue.**

Participants who do not complete all requirements of the qualification will be issued with a Statement of Attainment of partial completion of **RII30719 - Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue** for the unit competencies successfully completed.
